NEWSLETTER TO PARENTS

END OF FIRST TERM 2025/2026 ACADEMIC SESSION

1. We are grateful to God for His sustenance throughout the First Term of 2025/2026 Academic Session. We also wish to thank our dear parents for cooperating with the School to achieve its desired goals.

SCHOOL FEES

2. The tuition/boarding fees and other charges are to be paid to any Zenith Bank Branch into account number 1228370177 in favour of Air Force Comprehensive School Kaduna and printout be collected as evidence of payment. No cash payment will be accepted in the School on resumption day. Students must show evidence of full payment of fees at the gate before they will be allowed into the School premises on resumption day. Parents are to note that the additional ₦2,000.00 collections for MSS/FCS/YCS was in line with HQ NAF endorsement as it was noted that the earlier charge by HQ NAF was grossly inadequate to cater for the needs of the worship centers. In addition, the charge of ₦1,000.00 for practical by HQ NAF was observed to be inadequate. However, the schools do not have powers to increase any charge without recourse to HQ NAF's approval. To this effect, parents would be requested to provide some items to augment the ones that would be provided by the school during such practical pending HQ NAF's approval for such increase. Parents/guardians are kindly encouraged to note that any fee or money paid into the School Account will not be refunded. As such, parents are kindly advised to be extremely careful while making payment into the School Account. Fees for Second Term 2025/2026 Academic Session are indicated in the table below:

The Parent of JSS 1 students should note that the hike in some of the statutory charges in some items were as a result of HQ NAF decision of exempting them to pay for the items last term. Consequently, they are directed to move the payment to this term. This was done in order to lessen the financial burden on them last term.

Parents of SS 3 and JSS 3 students are to note that the registration fees for WAEC/NECO/BECE/JAMB are tentative as any additional fee from the examination bodies would be communicated to them for possible payment.

DISCIPLINE

3. During the term, it has been observed with concern that some students' behaviour was not consistent with the School Rules and Regulations. Such students were sanctioned accordingly. Parents are therefore advised to remind their wards on the need to obey the School Rules and Regulations. The School will not tolerate any act of indiscipline from the students. Note also that celebrations of birthdays are not allowed in the School. Similarly, it is against the School rules for students to be in possession of contraband while in school. Any act of lawlessness by students will be sanctioned accordingly. Also, the School does not condone examination malpractice, as such parents are to advise their wards to be studious and never indulge in any form of examination malpractice. Parents are also encouraged to teach their children on how to take care of their personal belongings while in school as well as monitor their children's activities during the holidays.

MANDATORY ITEMS

4. Parents are to ensure that their wards have all the mandatory items before returning to the School. Clearance will not be given to students with incomplete mandatory items on

-resumption. Parents are to note that the collection of ₦5,000.00 for cleaning materials as part of mandatory items was based on their agreement as it was observed that so many parents evade bringing the items. Please, find the list of mandatory items at Annex A.

UNIFORMS

5. The School uniforms for the Junior and Senior students must be sewn according to the approved specifications. Uniforms/shoes must conform to the approved colour. Brown sandal is to be worn with compound and worship wears, while canvas with white socks is to be worn during sporting activities. Furthermore, we appeal to parents to ensure that their ward(s) adhere strictly to these instructions. Uniforms not sewn in line with the approved colour, style and specifications will be confiscated and the affected student(s) will be punished accordingly. It has been observed with concern that Christian girls' students wear short skirt for worship against HQ NAF approved specifications. Consequently, parents are to ensure Christian girls' worship skirts are sewn to ankle length in line with HQ NAF specification. Furthermore, it has been observed that Muslim girls' students wear cap scarf and different colours of hijab which is against HQ NAF dress code for them. Hence, they are to desist from that and ensure they adhere strictly to the approved design and colour of the hijab which covers up to their foreheads. This is to avoid indecent and adherence to HQ NAF approved dress code. Henceforth, any student caught with short skirt, cap scarf and different colour of uniform will be punished severely. Also, shoes not worn with appropriate dress code would be confiscated. In addition to the above, it has been observed with concern that students are fond of coming to school with mufti which they use to break bounds as well as indiscriminately wearing them against the school rules. Thus, parents are advised to discourage their ward from coming into the school with mufti as failure to adhere to this directive will attract confiscation and severe sanctions.

PTA MEETING/VISITING DAY

6. The Open/PTA Meeting/Visiting Day activities for Second Term 2025/2026 Academic Session is scheduled for 28 February 2026. Parents/class teachers' interaction forum will hold between 08.00am to 10.00am and it is mandatory. On the other hand, the PTA meeting will commence between 11.00am to 1.00pm while Visiting Day activities will end by 5.00pm.

HOLIDAY ACTIVITIES

7. Parents are advised to engage their ward(s) in educative programmes during the vacation, particularly in English Language and Mathematics. Such programmes are necessary to occupy and prepare them for serious academic work next term. Parents should also ensure personal security of the children by not allowing them to go to unsafe places.

HEALTH MATTERS

8. Parents are advised to report any special medical needs of their wards as well as deposit all medications to the School Sick Bay on resumption. Parent should note that no student is allowed to be in possession of medication/drugs in the school for whatsoever reason. Failure to abide by this will attract severe sanctions.

ACADEMIC ATTITUDE OF STUDENTS

It has been observed with great concern and worries about the unwholesome behaviors of some students towards their academic activities in the school particularly the SS 3 STUDENTS. This is because after several counseling and warnings by both the school and invited parents, some of these SS 3 students still exhibit lack of seriousness on their academic activities. For instance, some SS 3 students were observed and reported of not attending their lessons at will. After this, some of the SS 3 students were again reported of blatantly refusing to submit their assignments given to them as well as Continuous Assessment Test scripts during the collation. It is disheartening to note that one of the SS 3 student tore his script on the invigilator that "he doesn't need it".

Furthermore, some SS 3 students were caught and reported for watching film during their Computer Base Test (CBT) practice organized by the school in preparation for their JAMB exams. It has also been observed with great worry that it is the SS 3 students that have the highest number of students that go on pass. This trend also contributes in distracting them from their studies. In a bid to finding solutions to these unwarranted behaviors of SS 3 students, it was reliably discovered that some of these passes were used as an avenue to register them for WAEC GCE by their parents with a view to obtaining WAEC results. This act is commonly referred to as NON-APPEARANCE.

The dangers of this act is that it will make the concerned student(s) not to be serious with their studies and more dangerously influence other serious students in the school thereby affecting their WAEC GCE performance which the school is trying to guard against. Accordingly, as part of the measures to mitigate this menace, the school reported the issue to HQ NAF and it was directed that any student caught not taking his/her academic activities serious, his/her parent/guardian would be asked to write a letter of undertaking that if his/her ward fails to take his/her academic activities serious again will be withdrawn from the school. This measure became imperative in order for the school to maintain high academic performance it has been known for over the years in all its external and internal exams.

In view of the forgoing, parents/guardians are respectfully requested to kindly advise their children/wards to take their academics seriously both in the school and at home.

SPIRITUAL ATTACK ON STUDENTS BY JINN IN THE SCHOOL

I am directed to respectfully draw the attention of the parents/guardians of students with challenge of spiritual attack by Jinn which has reached a worrisome level and requires urgent and proactive action. This is because these students exhibit violent behaviors that are both harmful to themselves and their fellow students as well as disrupting academic activities in the school.

For instance, there was an incident where one of the Jinn possessed students took a log of wood and hit a fellow student on the eye thereby inflicting a severe injury on him. Also, there was a time where some of the Jinn possessed students got injured by hitting themselves on the wall and glasses thereby inflicting injuries on themselves. Further to this, at various times some of these Jinn possessed students demonstrated violent behaviors by carrying harmful objects close to them to chase fellow students and staff which resulted in the disruption of academic activities in the school.

Accordingly, affected parents were contacted to take the Jinn possessed students home with a view to finding solutions to the challenge. Although this was done, however, it was observed with great worry that the problem still persist with even more violent traits. Therefore, continuous cohabitation of the Jinn possessed students with other fellow students in the school will be dangerous not only to other students but to themselves. Although some of the parents suggested that their children should be allowed to operate as day students, it was however not approved because the school was not structured to operate as day school. This is because if this is allowed the aim of establishing the school would be defeated. Consequently, considering the grave danger associated with allowing the Jinn possessed students to cohabit with others in the school, it was directed that parents of affected students should write an undertaking that if such Jinn behaviors are manifested again in their children after being allowed to take them home for treatment will attract outright withdrawal from the school. Better still, it was advised that the affected parents could kindly apply for the transfer of their children from the school.

SUBMISSION OF MTN SIM CARD AND NIN MIGRATION

9. Parents of SS 3 are encouraged to get an MTN SIM Card for their wards and ensure it is being put to use in preparation for their external examination registration and subsequent submission in Second Term 2025/2026 Academic session. Also, you are to ensure the migration of your ward's NIN so that we can have seamless JAMB registration.

RESUMPTION FOR SECOND TERM 2025/2026 ACADEMIC SESSION

10. Resumption date for Second Term 2025/2026 Academic Session is on Saturday 3 January 2026. School forecast of events' is at Enclosure 2. Students are to be within the School premises not later than 5:00pm on resumption date. Any student that resume after 5pm will not be attended to. Clean up and preparation for lessons commence on Monday, 5 January 2026.
